| 3 | McConnell Dowell Decmil Joint Venture Project Update  Nicole and Trevor welcomed and thanked everyone for joining them.  General and Health and Safety:  • The Project has completed 400,000 hours of works so far and is approximately 40% of the way through from a time point of view. Approximately 2 million tonnes of fill have been imported so far, with 1 million tonnes to go  • Despite inclement weather, the Project continues to make great progress. Utilities works and bridge construction is the current focus  • Due to COVID-19, the job has been broken up into segments to keep employees separate. The site teams take social distancing seriously and minimise contact between groups.  Community Engagement  • Permitted working hours are between 7am – 7pm Monday to Friday although team is working to ensure that gates are closed by 6pm and lights are off afterwards. The lights are on a timer to ensure safety of workers leaving  • On Saturdays, working hours are between 7am – 3:30pm. Sometimes work will need to be carried out after these times  • The weekend work is mostly due to relocation of almost all services on roads, with more than 200 to protect or relocate. This work is quite visible, but the team is doing their best to minimise ongoing disruptions to community  • A video highlighting the work being undertaken will be shared with members and through MRPV's social media channels. | Trevor Cruden<br>Nicole Ekert |

|   | Zone 1: Dingley Bypass to Centre Dandenong Road   |           |
|   | <ul> <li>The safety barriers will come down and be replaced by bollards shortly</li> <li>Drainage underneath the Freeway in this area is being built</li> <li>Some asphalting and works to build the kerbing have been completed on the Freeway just south of Dingley Bypass, the first asphalting on the Project.</li> </ul>   |           |
|   | Zone 2: Centre Dandenong Road to Lower Dandenong Road   |           |
|   | <ul> <li>Construction of Reinforced Earth Wall (RE Wall) north of Centre Dandenong<br/>Road is complete and piling to start building the bridge will begin in early-July.</li> </ul>  |           |
|   | Zone 3: Lower Dandenong Road to Park Way  |           |
|   | <ul> <li>Construction on the RE Wall south of Lower Dandenong Road has started</li> <li>The base, walls, and roof of the pedestrian underpass at Park Way and Braeside Park have been built. The entry walls are still being built, but 75% complete</li> <li>It will be a well-lit structure to improve the safety of people using it. Updated designs will be released showing what it will look like shortly.</li> </ul>   |           |

|   | <ul> <li>Fill material is continuing to be brought in between Park Way and Governor<br/>Road to build the foundations of the Freeway.</li> </ul>  |           |

|   | <ul> <li>Fill material is continuing to be brought in on both sides of Governor Road. The north side should be finished early-July, with the south side complete late-July</li> <li>The area will continue to take shape in the next three months</li> <li>Work to start building the twin bridges of the Waterways wetlands has started</li> <li>Building the foundations for the bridge will take around 2 months to complete</li> <li>Environmental controls are in place to protect the wetlands during our works.</li> </ul> |           |

|   | Discussion:  Members asked whether project is still on track for completion date. Trevor advised they are on track to finish by the end of 2021  Members commented on the different piling method used in the Waterways wetlands. Trevor explained that the method to bore piles is the same principle, but less disruptive and is beneficial when working in a sensitive environment next to people and wildlife. Trevor explained the method is unique to wetlands area. The rest of the bridges will be built using driven piling method  Members asked whether the community will be able to ride their bike down the Freeway before it opens. Nicole advised that an Open Day would take place  Members would like to know more about how the raised earth is going to be finished off. The Project Team advised that a future CRG meeting could be used to show pictures and designs of how landscaping and urban design will look, advising that effort has been made to do a high-class landscaping finish with noise walls that hide the traffic and protect from noise  Members requested further information about whether landscaping will be Indigenous or local/native and project team advised that there is a good representation of Indigenous plants. Luke advised that a landscape concept plan which shows plants, shrubs and trees is being developed and will be shared with CRG members and the community before next meeting for discussion  Members were interested in movement of site offices and raised concerns about some lighting facing into residential properties. Question about precautions being taken to ensure lights are not left on at the end of the day. The Project Team advised that lighting is on a timer and that they should turn off on their own. If they do not turn off, residents are advised to contact 1800 105 105 and the JV will ensure someone goes down to turn them off  Members ask |             |

The Project Team advised that questions and ideas for future discussion points from members could be sent directly to the Project Team</li> <li>Members asked about the temporary closure of Governor Road based on discussion in previous CRG meetings. The Project Team advised that it is still being explored as an option and outcomes communicated</li> <li>Members asked if their emails can be shared amongst the group between meetings.
